

Saskatchewan Beef Biosecurity Guidelines for Segregation Pen Funding:

- To be eligible, SK Beef Producers must:
 - o Have attended a VBP Beef Biosecurity workshop in Saskatchewan.
 - o Have livestock income in the previous tax year.
- Funding:
 - o 50% up to a maximum of \$1,000 per beef producer.
 - o Only one producer may apply on the same segregation pen.
 - o Producers may be rebated up to an additional \$1,000 for approved veterinary visit funding.
 - o Total Beef Biosecurity funding is a maximum of \$2,000 per producer.
- Segregation pens must:
 - o Be at least 3 m (10 ft) from other pen(s). A greater distance is recommended wherever possible.
 - o Not be in the same building as other pen(s).
 - o Have its own water source within the pen.
 - o Have drainage away from other pens.
 - Signage should be displayed for Segregation Pens to inform Visitors and Staff.
 - It is recommended that adequate shelter be present.
 - It is recommended that disinfection procedures be used after sick cattle have accessed the pen (see Canadian Beef Biosecurity Standard & Implementation Manual).
- Eligible costs:
 - o Materials for segregation pen construction (i.e. posts, rails, planks, gates, fasteners, portable or free standing panels).
 - o If portable or free standing panels are being claimed, the producer must be able to show other materials that help identify the project as a segregation pen (e.g. purchase of watering bowls or lumber, or pounding in posts to solidify the pen).
- Not eligible: Including but not limited to labour, buildings, feeders, electrical, rental equipment, watering bowls (water is funded under Farm & Ranch Water Infrastructure Program (FRWIP)).

- Pictures of the completed project must be included with the application. Pictures should clearly show required separation from other pens, drainage, and water source.
